

Swansea Marina Summer Trail

At the Dawsons office turn right up the steps

At the top of the steps turn right

Keep walking towards the civic centre

Now turn all the way back around and walk along the path towards The Observatory, along the coast taking in Swansea's 'open air museum'

Continue along the coastal path stopping at the wonderful statues along the way...

Continue walking to the second big sail and turn left into Fisherman's Way CAREFUL OF THE ROAD CROSSING HERE BEFORE THE STATUE

*FYI

There is a park to play, if you continue along the coastal path to Aurora



Turn so the statue is behind you and now walk towards the marina down the slope (CAREFUL OF THE ROAD CROSSING AT THE PILLARS) netbop should now be on your left.

Follow the path around the marina to your right

What colour are the lampposts on your left?

What's your favourite name of the boats in the marina today?

Stop at the Captain Cat statue and tell us what Dylan Thomas story is he in?



NOW Cross the marina on the swing bridge only when safe to do so

On the left there is a red brick building what is it called?

Just past the Pump House, look to the big windows on your right, where is the no 7 red tram going?

Who is always sat on a chair here in this square?



The Pump House, constructed around 1900, originally housed large boilers that supplied steam to hydraulic pumps. These pumps powered essential dock machinery, including a swing bridge that rotated to allow ships to enter or leave the South Dock.



Here why not take a stop and visit the National Waterfront Museum or the Swansea Museum both have free entry and toilet facilities!

Continue to follow the path with the National Waterfront Museum on your right

Here you will find some old rusty boats, on the red and white one what are the words on the life buoys?

What is the name of the restaurant you pass on your right hand side opposite the Copper Jack Boat Trips?

Turn right at the Anchor restaurant CAREFUL OF THE ROAD

How many arches are open for you to walk through here?

This boat is called the Helwick and has lots of history you can find out inside

As you walk through the arches, what do you call the large bridge on the left in front of you?

Now turn right and walk past the LC - Home of Wales' largest water park

Walk towards the grass area, can you tell us what the letters are on the grass?

At the end of the letters turn right taking the path next to the wall

What building is the other side of the wall?



Now turn left and stay on this road heading towards Morgans CAREFUL OF THE ROAD

Look up to find the clock on the grey Exchange building, what time does it show?

As you look across to the green area ahead of you what can you spot in the trees?

The Post House was once the home of the local Evening Post, and it even got printed here

As you look up to Morgans Hotel, what flag is flying today?

Morgans Hotel was once the home of The Harbour Trust where captains would register their ships which is why their rooms are named after ships that sailed here
